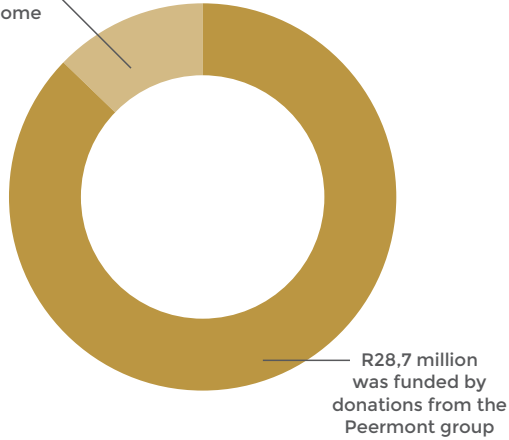

Entrepreneurial Development



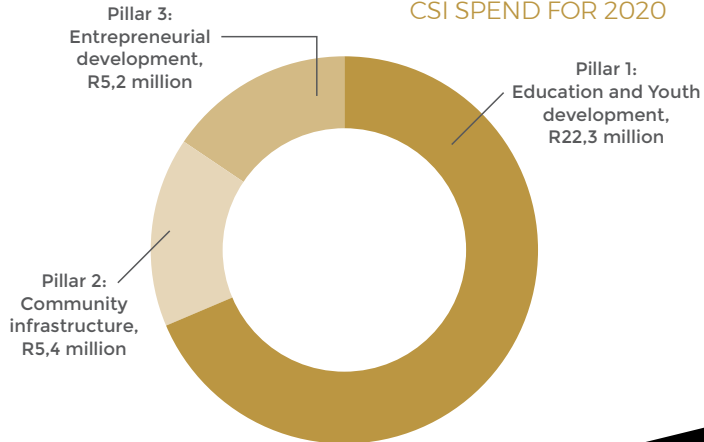

EDUCATION AND YOUTH DEVELOPMENT



Providing disadvantaged children and youth with the educational tools and access to quality education, from the foundation phase all the way through to university scholarships and career development.

PEERMONT COMMUNITY BENEFIT TRUST

The Lesedi Programme offers sponsorship for trades or similar qualifications to deserving young people from Ekurhuleni. 5 learners were sponsored to learn electrical, plumbing, carpentry and air conditioning maintenance skills. PCBT spent a total of R165 982 on this programme.

PEERMONT CHILDREN'S TRUST

The Trust provides social, educational and emotional upliftment to children in disadvantaged areas of Ekurhuleni, primarily through financial support for their education and holistic growth and development.

In collaboration with Star Schools, learners from Grades 10 to 12 are given extra lessons in Mathematics, Science and English. 60 learners benefited from this project and over R530 000 was invested.

EDUCATION AND YOUTH DEVELOPMENT



PEERMONT EDUCATION TRUST (PET)

The PET sponsors disadvantaged learners to study a variety of university courses, and finding employment in big-name firms. Over R1,1 million was invested in 13 students with full bursaries.

Granted bursaries for further education to employees who were retrenched. 138 ex-employees benefited from this initiative to the value of over R2,1 million.



EDUCATION AND YOUTH DEVELOPMENT

GRACELAND

invested over R4 000 in the following:

- Boxing Ring was sponsored to upgrade our boxing facilities, used by a local MMA club.
- Golf Development – sponsored young, talented youth with membership and development. Also sponsored free lessons, food and accommodation to development school.

- Food hampers valued at P30 000 to 55 families



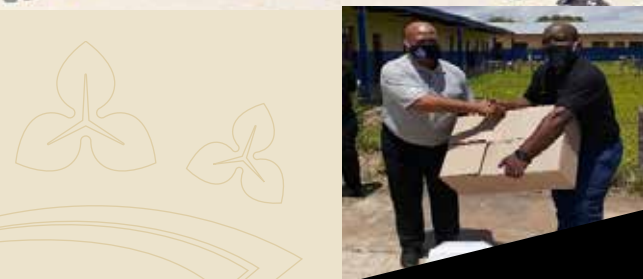
KHORONI

COMMUNITY INFRASTRUCTURE

Improving infrastructure, safety and social services is the main priority of this pillar. These Peermont CSI initiatives consist of community support and financial investments to the surrounding areas in which we operate.

EMPERORS PALACE

supported local community schools with PPE donations (i.e. masks, hand sanitizers, and bathroom soap dispensers). A total of 270 000 learners from 180 schools benefited from this project valuing over R5,7 million.

PEERMONT'S COMMUNITY BENEFIT TRUST (PCBT)

in conjunction with flagship resort Emperors Palace assisted 3 local businesses in the Ekurhuleni area who were affected by the looting that occurred in July 2021 with R750 000.



EMPERORS PALACE

assisted 9 local charities who support the less fortunate in the Ekurhuleni area with R2,9 million in used and new linen consisting of feather duvets, sheets, pillow cases, curtains, throws, towels and other hotel room accessories.

FRONTIER INN

supported local community organisations with R115 937

ENTERPRISE AND SUPPLIER DEVELOPMENT

The Peermont group continues to focus on the implementation and development of enterprise and supplier development strategies in terms of the DTI's B-BBEE scorecard. The following are some examples of interactions and initiatives that have taken place at our various properties during 2021:

- Several resorts assist car washes that offer their services both to guests visiting our properties as well as to other guests wishing to use their service. Resorts further offer free car washes to guests on certain tiers of the Peermont Winners Circle Loyalty Programme when visiting the operation thereby utilising the project's services. Assistance is provided to these projects through provision of water, soap, wash bays, shade netting, electricity, as well as machines and the maintenance thereof. Carwashes invested in in 2020 include Ubidi Cash Wash (Umfolozzi, R433 000), Dumisane Car Wash (Graceland, R39 000), Mmabatho Palms Car Wash (R64 000), Mathabontleng Car Wash (Thaba Moshate, R137 400) and Mzi's Car Wash (Rio, R11 000).
- Frontier Inn invested in the Corner Store with equipment and expertise to the value of R23 500
- Graceland invested R12 600 in Bongani's Vending Machines, R147 000 in Sombane Cleaning, R92 000 in Rootz Spa, R156 000 in Radio Langa and R18 000 in eMbalenhle Recycling.



- Khoroni invested in Thanganelana projects, a community garden service, to the value of R144 000.
- Mmabatho Palms invested in the local Kiosk (R19 000) and a Vegetable Garden (R257 000)
- Rio invested R217 000 in the Hot House gardens to grow vegetables, R71 000 in the Trio Go Kart Track and R2400 in R enterprises with company registration.
- Thaba Moshate invested R132 000 in Difokeng Spa and R21 800 in Serotong Sweets Shop
- Umfolozi invested R364 000 in MV Trading for gardening services and R71 000 in Ubidi Security who both provided on-complex services.
- The Grand Palm sponsored venue-hire (P57 000) to young and upcoming YouTubers creating content and advocating for recognition in a space where they are not paid as well as other content creators across the world.
